

2. Establishing an RSS Feed


- What to Do: Set up an RSS feed to act as the central hub for your podcast. This is where your podcast episodes are stored and distributed to streaming platforms.

4. Intro/Outro Production


- What to Do: Create a professional intro and outro for your podcast, incorporating custom music or a voiceover.

- **How to Execute**: Commission custom music and voiceovers from talented creators on platforms like Fiverr, ensuring originality and copyright compliance.






Pink Yellow Gradient Podcast Cover
